


### Verb to be

O verbo *to be* é usado para descrever características ou estados temporários de pessoas e objetos. Por exemplo:

*I am a basketball player.* (Eu sou um jogador de basquete) – Uma das suas características é ser um jogador de basquete

*I am happy to see you!* (Eu estou feliz em te ver!) – Expressando o sentimento (temporário) de felicidade

Nós usamos diferentes formas (conjugações) do verbo to be dependendo da pessoa do discurso



Subject pronoun (pronome sujeito)	Verb "to be"	Contraction (contração/forma reduzida)
1	Am	l'm
You	Are	You're
He, she, it	Is	He's, She's, It's
We	Are	We're
You	Are	You're
They	Are	They're



### Uses of the verb to be

### <u>Names</u>

I am Alice/ My name is Alice.

Age

Jessica is 6 years old.

Alice is twelve years old.

The students are 12 years old.

**Feelings** 

Mary and John are sad.

The team is not excited to play...

<u>Nationalities</u>

I am English/ I am from England.

Are you Brazilian? / No, we are Bolivian.

**Professions** 

You are a nurse.

Is she a lawyer?

He is a doctor.

Role or relationship

We are a team.

Are you the manager?

We are married.

They are friends.

She is my girlfriend.

**Location** 

I am at the supermarket.

They are on vacation.



# Negative form

Subject + verb to be + not

1	Am	I am/I'm not from Nicaragua
You	Are	You are/ You're not polite.
He, she, it	Is	It is/It's not an apple
We	Are	We are/We're athletes
You	Are	You are/You're 60 years old
They	Are	They are/They're beautiful

# Interrogative form

Verb to be + subject

Am	I	Am I your roommate?
Are	You	Are you at the hospital?
Is	He, she, it	Is this seat available?
Are	We	Are we smart?
Are	You	Are you excited?
Are	They	Are they Indian?

# Negative questions

Verb to be + not (n't) + subject

Am	1	Aren't I <sup>1</sup> your best friend?
Are	You	Aren't you a worker?
Is	He, she, it	Isn't the situation terrible?
Are	We	Aren't we intelligent?
Are	You	Aren't you anxious?
Are	They	Aren't Beyoncé and Jay Z
		amazing?

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Em contextos extremamente formais, a pergunta negativa com "eu" aparece como *Am I not?* No entanto, na maior parte do tempo, você vai ver e usar a forma *Aren't I? (Are not I?)*.
